INTRO: (just strum each chord once while one person solos)

Who never ever learned to read or write so well

VERSE 2:

[C] He used to carry his guitar in a gunny sack
[C] Go sit beneath the tree by the railroad track

[C] Strumming with the rhythm that the drivers made

[G7] The people passing by they would stop and say

[C] "Oh my what that little country boy could play"

(CHORUS)

(INTRO/solo)

VERSE 3:

[C] His mother told him "someday you will be a man

[C] And you will be the leader of a big old band

[F] Many people coming from miles around

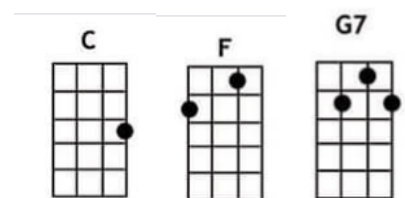
[C] To hear you play your music when the sun go down

VERSE 3:

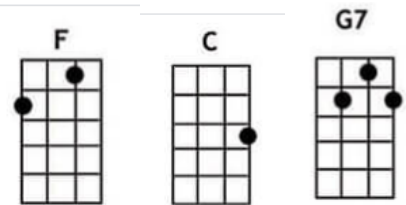

(CHORUS, and then a solo with the same chords, so play the Chorus twice!)

VERSE 2:

I must admit they have a [D] rockin' band,
man, they were blowin' like a [E7] hurricane.

That's why I go for that...

(CHORUS)

VERSE 3:

Way down South they had a [E7] jubilee,
those Georgia folks they had a [A] jamboree.
They're drinkin' home brew from a [D] wooden
cup,
The folks all dancin' got me [E7] all shook up...

(CHORUS, then play chords of CHORUS again for solo)
